#### **SUMMARY:**

**Total Volunteer hours: 489** 

This includes the donation bed, the Islamic Centers Plot, the community garden as a whole and work days.

Watering Volunteer hours: 263

This includes the donation garden, Islamic Center Plots, Flower Garden Beds, and flower barrels.

Watering thoughts: It became very evident that water/lack of water was a bigger issue this year. We had to add an adapter and several additional hoses to accommodate watering/ watering time restriction and access for gardeners. I had 8 dedicated waters this summer to help out with keeping our plot, the flower gardens, and the Islamic Centers plots watered. Unfortunately I lost 2 of my regular waterers mid season due to relocation. We help maintain/water the Islamic Center's plots and in combitionation with the Donation plot and flower areas, it is a lot of watering for a very large area and very time consuming especially with the lack of rain this season. We would like to move forward with a more efficient and sustainable way to water.

**General Garden Thoughts:** We had a hard summer season this year and lost several seeds and plants to lack of water, and vegetables & fruits to theft and bunnies (not sure how as it is locked and gated but very specific items were stolen, pears, cucumbers and eggplants). Solar lighting may help light the area as it is very dark in the garden at night. Lighting in and around the garden will help with safety at night as well. Will be reinforcing our donation garden plot with chicken wire in the 2022 season. Tree's have gotten bigger on the property causing a bit more shade in areas, and have transitioned some areas to grow more herbs and semi shade vegetables.

### **Retaining Wall:**

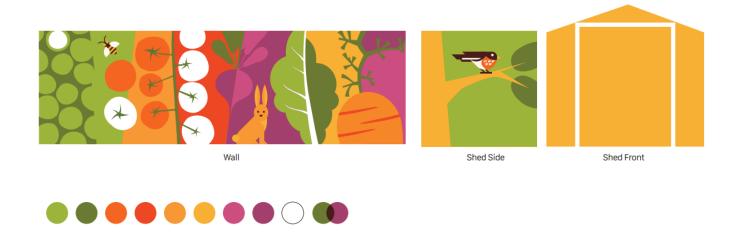
Initially the landscape architect (they donated their time) designed the retaining walls and thought they'd be able to obtain materials at little to no cost. That plan fell through and we used the \$2,000 allocated for that project and funds from bed rentals to complete the larger of the retaining walls. We are hoping to complete the 2nd retaining wall in 2022 if funds are available.

### 2022 Projects:

**Front Entrance gate Gardens:** Add front gardens outside of the main entrance to the gate. We obtained free brick and would like to edge the garden from the sidewalk to avoid dirt runoff.

**Drip Soaker Hose System for Donation Plot:** We have been hand watering with the hose, it takes almost 2 hours a day to water all of the donation plot, the Islamic Center Plots, and the flower beds. We would like to add a drip soaker hose system to the donation garden to better water the plants at the base and to cut down on the time it takes for someone to water everything. Someone could multitask with the drip system instead of needing sometimes 2-3 people a day to keep all of the garden watered.

**Solar Lights:** In and around the garden. Would like to purchase ones to hang from the entrance gate, by the shed, and a few additional places around the garden to better light up the area at night for safety reasons. The plot is very dark at night and there is not a lot of lighting from the street lights.

**Update garden trellises:** Our previous ones we built need some updating and we would like to take advantage of our sunny areas since we have had areas become more shaded over the last 5 years.

### If Additional Funds are left over we would like to re-allocate those funds to the following, smaller projects:

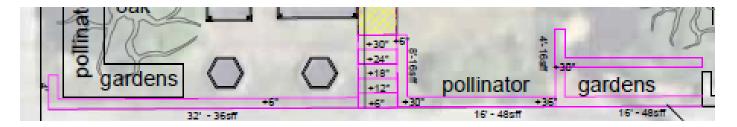
- Set up second hose/spigot station further down in the garden for additional spigot location (modeled after other community gardens)
- Add a community free library/free pantry outside the front entrance area
- Create additional bee and flower garden beds
- Re-wood chip walkways and front entrance

We would like to complete the retaining wall project which includes steps.

If funding is approved, we will order materials in the spring and have multiple work days to complete the project.

If there are unused funds remaining after the retaining wall project is complete, we would like to re-allocate those funds to the following, smaller projects:

- Set up temporary hose/spigot locations, using heavy duty hoses (modeled after other community gardens)
- Compost area build out
- Water tank add removable trellis panels to camouflage the tank and create more growing space
- Convert some of hydro tables into standing small gardens
- Build a donation box for produce, plants and seeds
- Wood chips in all paths
